

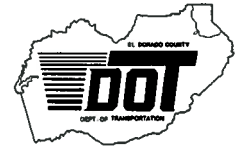

3.01	Section 10-1.17 on page SP-72	Question: Is the PCMS bid item for more than one PCMS Answer: Yes. One PCMS sign is required in each direction of travel as stated in section 10-1.17, therefore two PCMS are required for the project at 10 SWD each, for a total of 20 SWD. The contractor won't need the PCMS for the entire contract, just for 10 days when they close a lane to do the rebuild of the sidewalk and hauling dirt.
