Class II Bike Lane on Cameron Park Drive from Palmer Drive to Toronto Road

Contract No. PW 11-30614, CIP No.72307

The following is a summary of what was discussed at the non-mandatory pre-bid meeting on Monday, September 16, 2013:

ITEM NO.	LOCATION, PAGE OR DRAWING NO.	QUESTION/ANSWER
3.01.	SP-5	Question: Is the intention to construct the project this year? Slurry Seal can't be done after November due to temperatures. Answer: Yes, the intention is to construct everything with a possible suspension until spring for the slurry seal. See SP-5 regarding possible temporary suspension of the slurry seal item of work due to unsuitable weather conditions.
3.02.	Plans	Question: Will temporary striping need to be installed and maintained over the winter? Answer: No. The existing edge line will not be affected by the widening.
3.03.	Plans	Question: 1) Is there a Slurry Seal on Cameron Park Drive now? 2) If not, why are we slurry sealing the bike lane? 3) Why not grind the pavement outside the fog line and overlay the width needed for the bike lane? Answer: 1) No. 2) We are widening approximately 2 feet on the west side to create 4-foot wide bike lanes. The slurry seal will cover the difference in look between the old and new pavement. 3) There is no widening on the east side, only the placement of shoulder backing. Therefore grinding and overlay instead of slurry seal would not be cost effective.
3.04.	SP-55	Question: What are the hours for lane closure? Answer: See Addendum No. 1

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3.05.	N-1	Question: How many working days are in the
