1.	n/a	Question: Are the logging operations complete?
2.	Special Provisions §4-1.03 (page SP- 13) and §10-1.24 (page SP-88)	Answer: Yes. Question: Is the contractor responsible for submitting a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP)? Answer: See the third bulleted item under Special Provisions Section 4-1.03. A complete SWPPP is available for review at Transportation's Tahoe Engineering office.
3.	Special Provisions §10-1.00, Item 37 (page SP-68)	Question: Is the County expecting the contractor to complete certain milestones before having to winterize the project? Answer: Refer to the second paragraph under Item 37, Winterization.
4.	Special Provisions §4-1.03 (page SP- 13) and §10-1.15 (page SP-79)	Comment: The asphalt concrete specification is unclear in requiring PG 64-28 vs. PG 64-28PM. Answer: The contractor must submit an asphalt concrete mix design to meet the specifications of either PG 64-28 or PG 64-28PM.
5.	Special Provisions §10-1.15 (page SP-79)	Question: It appears that the 2" sieve gradation should be 1/2" sieve gradation. Is this correct? Answer: The aggregate gradation table shown is correct.
