Election Topic: Voter Registration

The increased interest in the election process has been noticed by the increase in voter registration. To register to vote in El Dorado County you must first meet required qualifications:

- A citizen of the United States
- A resident of El Dorado County
- You will be at least 18 years or older by the next Election Day
- You are not currently serving a state or federal prison term on conviction of a felony
- You have not been found mentally incompetent to vote by a court

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How to Register to Vote

The California Secretary of State offers an online registration portal for individuals to register to vote. As part of this process, you must have a California Driver's License or Identification Card to fully complete your registration online. The last question you will be asked: "Will you allow the system to use your DMV signature?" If you say "Yes" your online registration will be forwarded to us, if you answer "No" you will be required to print the completed form, sign, and mail it to our office. Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is required to offer you voter registration services during the conduct of regular business activities.

For voter registration forms you can contact our office to request a form be mailed to you, pick up a form at any Post Office, Library, or Public Office.

Public service agencies identified as National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) departments must offer voter registration services during the conduct of regular business activities.

Report of Registration

As part of a defined schedule, the first report of registration for the year was due on February 10, 2025. This is a snapshot in time of how many registered voters are in the county, including individual districts. These totals are used for election related activities like initiative petitions and recall petitions.
