While most of the work is done through free advice on the phone or in person, and occasionally through free transport, there are times when actual money is required.

The American Legion's mission is to serve Veterans.

El Dorado Post 119 has well over 400 members who served in the military. Other volunteers come from the Auxiliary, Sons, and Riders.

There is a great deal of internal scrutiny, support, and volunteer energy. Accountability is very important to the Legion.

A mother holding her infant, standing with David Zelinsky, Service Officer, heard the power was back on immediately after the PG&E bill was paid at Walmart.

A Veteran escapng domestic abuse was given emergency housing, and did not have to spend a single night on the street. within three days, she was in a long term shelter with her teen age son, and gas was provided for her to drive to the shelter, and to drive her son to school.

So, one life at a time.

The measurable objectives will be that Veterans and their families, will be housed, fed, and able to get to where they need to be, whether it is to work, probation or DUI classes.

How will the objectives be measured?

Did the gas get into the car? Did they get food from their Safeway gift card? Is the power back on? Are they in compliance with the court system?
